The site was designed to be conservative and professional, yet also intuitive and easy to use.

The complete redesign and redevelopment consisted of many components. A major component to this project was the Clearinghouse, which is a robust search that pulls information from all areas of the site; both databased and static content. What's more, the site also features dynamic video that site visitors may watch in order to learn more about the different areas of the new site.
